What has been enacted?

Grandparents in A/N/D and TPR cases § 7B-401.1. Parties. (e2) Grandparent. - A grandparent is not a party to the case and shall be allowed to intervene if one of the following applies:

 Both parents of the juvenile are deceased.
 One parent of the juvenile is deceased and is known. One parent of the juvenile is deceased and no other parent

(3) One parent of the juvenile is deceased and any other parent's rights have been terminated.

§ 7B-1103. Who may file a petition or motion.

8) A grandparent of the juvenile if all known parents are deceased and the motion is to terminate the parental rights of an unknown parent.

Unlicensed Family Foster Home

Requires State DSS to develop and implement a policy that allows an individual who is related to a child and providing foster care to a child in a family foster home to be reimbursed for the provision of care without having to meet the requirements for licensure. New: includes any halfsibling of that child, effective 7/8/2024.

Blood, Marriage, Adoption

New: any half sibling of child

Safe Babies Court

Creating a Safe Babies Court (SBC) program in NC is a recommendation from Chief Justice Paul Newby's ACES-Informed Courts Task Force.

Currently, there are five pilot counties that will implement SBC: New Hanover, Mitchell and Yancey, Brunswick and Durham.

"SBC connects babies, toddlers, and their families involved in the child welfare court system with intensive support and services designed to promote healthy child development while working to ensure a safe and timely exit from foster care. This means there are frequent judicial status conferences and family team meetings to provide additional oversight and ensure the family's needs are met and the case is not lingering in the court system."

The House and Senate of the NCGA will reconvene on the following dates:

- Monday, September 9, 2024, at 12:00.
- Wednesday, October 9, 2024, at 12:00.
 Tuesday, November 19, 2024, at 12:00.
- Wednesday, December 11, 2024, at 12:00.
- Adjourn sine die* on Friday, December 13, 2024.

For all sessions other than the November session, items generally limited to vetoes, appointments, litigation, and elections.

During the November session, the following topics are allowed: bills directly and primarily affecting the state budget; constitutional amendments; bills that crossed over; bills and resolutions implementing the recommendations of study commissions; local bills filed by May 7, 2024; appointments and confirmations, and other topics.

- \succ Use of illegal controlled substance or abuse of alcohol
 - ✓ Criteria for nonsecure

 - ✓ Definition of neglected juvenile
 ✓ Aggravating factor (in utero included)
- ➤ Development and attachment needs of juvenile
- \succ Once with a foster parent for 9 months = "nonrelative kin"
- ≻TPR standing: 15 months placement

Budget

IDS' highest priority for the short session is enough funds for the Private Assigned Counsel ("PAC") Fund to allow IDS to continue to pay PAC uninterrupted through 6/30/2025.

IDS initially requested \$12 million for the PAC Fund. Since the original short-term request, IDS asked for an additional \$20 million to be held in reserve due to an "historic and unabated demand on the PAC Fund."



ECourts Expanding to All 100 Counties in 2025

ECourts currently serves about half of North Carolina's population in its three largest cities and 38 counties across the coastal, piedmont, and mountain regions.
