

235.30 POINTING A LASER DEVICE TOWARDS AN AIRCRAFT. FELONY.

The defendant has been charged with pointing a laser device at an aircraft.

For you to find the defendant guilty of this offense, the State must prove two things beyond a reasonable doubt:

First, the defendant willfully pointed a laser<sup>1</sup> device at an aircraft<sup>2</sup>, while the laser device was emitting a laser beam.

And Second, the laser beam was emitted while the aircraft was [taking off] [landing] [in flight] [in motion].

If you find from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt that on or about the alleged date, the defendant willfully pointed a laser device at an aircraft, while the device was emitting a laser beam and while the aircraft was [taking off] [landing] [in flight] [in motion], it would be your duty to return a verdict of guilty. If you do not so find or have a reasonable doubt as to one or both of these things, it would be your duty to return a verdict of not guilty.
