271.41 UNLAWFUL USE OF A [DRIVER'S LICENSE] [LEARNER'S PERMIT] [SPECIAL IDENTIFICATION CARD] ISSUED BY THE DIVISION OF MOTOR VEHICLES. FELONY.

The defendant has been charged with the unlawful use of a [driver's license] [learner's permit] [special identification card] in the [commission] [attempted commission] of a felony.

For you to find the defendant guilty of this offense, the State must prove four things beyond a reasonable doubt:

<u>First</u>, that the defendant [presented] [displayed] [used] a [driver's license] [learner's permit] [special identification card].

<u>Second</u>, that the [driver's license] [learner's permit] [special identification card] contained a false or fictitious name.

<u>Third</u>, that the defendant [presented] [displayed] [used] the document in the [commission] [attempted commission] of a felony. (*Define the underlying felony*).

And Fourth, that the defendant acted knowingly.

If you find from the evidence beyond a reasonable doubt that on or about the alleged date the defendant [presented] [displayed] [used] a [driver's license] [learner's permit] [special identification card], which the defendant knew to contain a false or fictitious name, in the [commission] [attempted commission] of (name felony), it would be your duty to return a verdict of guilty. If you do not so find or have a reasonable doubt as to one or more of these things, it would be your duty to return a verdict of not guilty.
