203.66 STOPPING ON HIGHWAY - DISABLED TRUCKS, TRUCK TRACTORS, TRAILERS, OR SEMITRAILERS. N.C. Gen. Stat. § 20-161(c).1

The motor vehicle law provides that the operator of any [truck] [truck tractor] [trailer] [semitrailer] which is disabled upon any portion of the highway shall display warning devices of a type and in a manner as required under the rules and regulations of the United States Department of Transportation² as adopted by the Division of Motor Vehicles. Those regulations provide: (*Here state applicable regulations*).³

A violation of this law is negligence within itself.
