The motor vehicle law provides that the operator of a vehicle turning at an intersection<sup>2</sup> must follow the route which has been clearly indicated by the [buttons] [markers] [(name other direction signs)] placed at the intersection by the [Board of Transportation] [(name local authority)].<sup>3</sup>

A violation of this law is negligence within itself.
