215.16 REQUIRED LIGHTING EQUIPMENT - MOTORCYCLES - DAYTIME.

The motor vehicle law provides that every motorcycle shall be equipped with lighted [headlights] [taillights] at all times while the motorcycle is in operation upon a [highway] [public vehicular area].¹

Operating a motorcycle on a [highway] [public vehicular area] without such light(s) is negligence within itself.

^{1.} The 1973 General Assembly amended N.C. Gen. Stat. § 20-129, effective October 1, 1973, to require motorcycle headlights and taillights to be lighted at all times the motorcycle is in operation on a highway or public vehicular area. The statute also uses "lamp," not "light" -a usage which purists may wish to retain. See Bigelow v. Johnson, 303 N.C. 126, 277 S.E.2d 347 (1981), in which a flashlight was held not to comply with the requirements of the statute.
