225.22 DRIVING THROUGH SAFETY ZONE.

The motor vehicle law provides that it is unlawful for the operator of a vehicle at any time to drive through or over a safety zone.¹

A violation of this law is negligence within itself.

^{1.} A "safety zone," is defined at N.C. Gen. Stat. § 20-4.01(49) to be "a traffic island or other space officially set aside within a highway for the exclusive use of pedestrians and which is so plainly marked or indicated by proper signs as to be plainly visible at all times while set apart as a safety zone."
